Dear Ms. Elaine Weidman,

It was noticed that the *Business & Human Rights Resource Centre* on their website displayed a response from you hoping to clarify Ericsson's position on the communications with 34 local NGOs in China.

I have no doubt that you are aware of the April 24th 2010 report titled: "The IT Industry Has a Critical Duty to Prevent Heavy Metal Pollution", released by a coalition of Chinese NGOs.

As of date, none of the NGOs within the coalition have received a direct response from Ericsson.

On June 15th 2010 Pacific Environment (PE), a US NGO, forwarded to us a letter from Ericsson to PE, which said that "On June 10 we sent a reply to the organization Institute of Public and Environmental Affairs."

We found from the Ericsson letter to PE, which was posted in the PE letter, that Ericsson sent the letter to a wrong email address – IPE's staff's email is **wangjing162003@yahoo.com.cn** but Ericsson sent it to **wangjing163003@yahoo.com.cn**

We wrote the following message back to PE's project officer on June 17th: "Could we bother you to inform them of this wrong address issue and have them to send it again to Jing Jing? We can then respond to their letter in a formal way?"

We received an email on June 17th from PE that they would send Ericsson an email. But as of date we have received no direct reply from Ericsson.

We hope that this error in communication can be corrected quickly so that we could work together to review the key issues of pollution control in an effective manner. Would you please send us your response to the right email address? Again it is: **wangjing162003@yahoo.com.cn**
