Bytes Technology Group UK incorporates Bytes Software Services Limited and Bytes Security Partnerships Limited:

**Bytes Software Services** specialise in licensing, software asset management and training, working closely with partners to manage technology deployment.

**Bytes Security Partnerships** offer a wide-ranging portfolio of IT connectivity, data security, email and web communications, governance, security risk, and IT compliance solutions.

The Group does not tolerate any slavery or human trafficking within its business operations and takes a risk-based approach regarding its supply chains.

All Bytes employees have the necessary documentation to legally work in the UK and no-one under the legal minimum age for admission to work is employed.

The software business sector is not considered one most at risk and neither Bytes Software Services nor Bytes Security Partnerships have intricate supply chains, multiple levels of contracting and subcontracting, or partner with businesses based in impoverished regions of the world where labour laws are non-existent or not enforced. However, policies are in place to guard against such practices in our supply chains; all contracts with business partners require the prior approval at board level; and business partners may be subject to various forms of vetting, including the verification of information provided to the Group. Selective due diligence exercises will be performed, depending on the significance of the business partner to the continuity of the Group’s business.

Training about slavery and human trafficking is available for all Bytes employees.
