Our Approach

We are committed to ensuring that there is no modern slavery or human trafficking in our supply chains or in any part of our business by requiring majority of our supplier to adhere to Business Conduct and Ethics which states, among other standards, that:

- Our suppliers encourage freely chosen employment. Forced, bonded or indentured labor or involuntary prison labor is prohibited.
- Our suppliers do not engage in child labor. No person shall be employed younger than the
 minimum age permitted by laws of the country where the person is employed. Nor shall the
 Supplier interfere with a child's education by employing a child in violation of a country's
 compulsory education laws.

We will take measures to ensure compliance and address potential instances of non-compliance with our Supplier Code of Business Conduct and Ethics.

This statement is made pursuant to section 54(1) of the Modern Slavery Act 2015 and constitutes eBay's slavery and human trafficking statement for the financial year ending 31 December 2018.
