Contractors/consultants working on site at our premises also have the right to protection against modern slavery or human trafficking as part of the FRP Advisory Whistleblowing Policy.

During the last fiscal year, we published a statement detailing our support against modern slavery and human trafficking. Our operational infrastructure includes processes and procedures to identify potential risk areas through ongoing due diligence with our clients and procurement activities and we are committed to taking appropriate steps to ensure compliance with the legislation.

This fiscal year, as part of our GDPR activities we have reviewed all material supplier contracts to ensure compliance with the latest legislation including the necessary policies to protect against modern slavery and human trafficking within their business operations and supply chains.

To ensure all staff are aware of and have a clear understanding of the risk of modern slavery and human trafficking within our business, we request that all partners and staff confirm they have read and understood this statement as part of the firms' Annual Policy Declaration.

Our Information and Security team monitor risk associated with Supply Chain process and report their findings in accordance with internal procedures.

This statement is made pursuant to Section 54(1) of the Modern Slavery Act 2015 and constitutes the Partnership's slavery and human trafficking statement for the financial year ending April 2019.
