Global Foods is an independent cash & carry for caterers, on-trade, retail businesses and wholesale suppliers, with over 16000 products in stock and a turnover of 80M. The Company provides a reliable and efficient delivery service in South Wales, and a 70 kilometre radius from the Prince of Wales Bridge. The mission, *A name you can trust.*

The business has grown at its current site in Cardiff to employ over 110 staff, and has a customer base of over 16000.

Global Foods has hundreds of direct and indirect suppliers who provide, food ingredients, food products, hardware and, alcoholic and non-alcoholic drinks. The company is part of Unitas Wholesale which is the largest wholesale buying group in the UK.

Global Foods Limited is committed to ensuring that there is no modern slavery in the business and supply chain. The company is committed to act ethically, and with integrity in our business relationships.
