

# Modern Slavery Statement



## Aims

1. Strengthen safeguards against modern slavery by protecting vulnerable people from exploitation and increasing awareness of and resilience against this crime
2. Reduce the harm caused by modern slavery through improved victim identification and support
3. Identify individuals and Organised Crime Groups involved in modern slavery, ensuring they are managed, prosecuted and disrupt individuals and groups responsible for modern slavery
4. Prevent people from engaging in modern slavery
5. Develop enhanced support systems to be able to respond appropriately
6. Ensure professional and public can recognise and act on Modern Slavery
