INTRODUCTION

We are committed to protecting against any form of slavery and human trafficking throughout our business or in our supply chains. This statement sets out the steps we have taken during FY2018 both within our business and to monitor compliance by our suppliers.

OUR BUSINESS

We are a provider of audio visual production equipment for both rental and sale, based in Manchester but operate across Europe. We build on the sustainable nature of our business model with an equally responsible approach to how we conduct our business activities, both inside and outside of our organisation.

OUR POLICY ON SLAVERY AND HUMAN TRAFFICKING

We are committed to ensuring that there is no modern slavery or human trafficking in our supply chains or in any part of our business. We require all our employees and partners to act ethically and with integrity in all our business relationships and to implement and enforce effective systems and controls to ensure slavery and human trafficking is not taking place anywhere in our supply chains.

OUR SUPPLY CHAINS AND DUE DILIGENCE PROCESSES

Our supply chains are in the UK, the EU and the US. Our supply chains include reputable companies who provide materials, services and people to assist us in our projects. We expect all of our partners in our industry to comply with all relevant legislation including The UK Modern Slavery Act, and this is part of our due diligence process in selecting suppliers.

As part of our initiative to identify and mitigate risk, we have in place systems to:

- Identify and assess potential risk areas in our supply chains, which we currently assess to be a low risk given our high specification requirements.
- Mitigate the risk of slavery and human trafficking occurring in our supply chains, by using reputable suppliers and partners
- Monitor potential risk areas in our supply chains on an ongoing basis
- Protect whistleblowers.

TRAINING

To ensure a high level of understanding of the risks of modern slavery and human trafficking in our business, we have provided a training programme to certain staff which includes a knowledge

assessment and which we are rolling out in the key business areas, particularly staff who source suppliers.

FURTHER STEPS

We will continue with our training programme and supplier due diligence over FY 2018. This statement is made pursuant to section 54(1) of the Modern Slavery Act 2015 and constitutes the Neuron Pro Audio Modern Slavery Act statement for the financial year ending 31 December 2018. The above statement has been approved by the Board of Directors and signed on behalf of the Board.
