We have not encountered or been made aware of any infringements relating to this policy whilst undertaking our activities at any time. The Company Directors and senior management continue to take full responsibility for implementing this policy statement and its objectives and shall provide adequate resources and investment to ensure that slavery and human trafficking is not taking place within the organisation and within its supply chains and review this accordingly throughout the year.
